Archbishop Michael of the Eastern Diocese, Ukrainian Greek Orthodox Church, refused to discuss his years of

**hard labor in the 1930s. "It would take too long to tell," he said.**

He was released in 1937 and returned to the Ukraine, but was then uprooted by the war and forced to go to Germany. Fourteen years ago he came to Canada. He still rejoices in that decision.

"I thank God from the bottom of my heart that I came to Canada," he said.

Prime Minister Lester Pearson and Opposition Leader John Diefenbaker sent their best wishes yesterday. Archbishop Michael turned 80 last July, but celebrated his birthday on the feast of his patron saint, Archangel Michael.

His friends last night gave him a present of an undisclosed sum of money which he plans to spend publishing his books. He has written his own story and poetry, and composes liturgical music.

Of the eight years' captivity he would say only: "They always tried to break my faith. I carried rocks in a wheelbarrow."

Now, he says, "I feel very good. The future is with God."

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
